Dancewear Requirements 2017 - 2018

Appropriate uniform minimizes distractions in class, and allows the instructor to see the students' bodies clearly to make appropriate corrections to their technique. If the instructor has difficulty seeing what is going on with a student's body, she is unable to help the student to dance safely and to their fullest potential.

Part of what we are trying to instill in our students is a sense of discipline and an understanding of the etiquette that comes along with proper dance training. Please be respectful of the art form by coming to class properly groomed. **Students who are not following the dress code may be asked to sit out of class. Prior to this happening, the teacher will speak with the parent about the student's attire.**

If your dancer has any classes back to back with ballet, they may wear their ballet attire into the jazz class and pull shorts overtop of the bodysuit if they wish. If you have to purchase a specific leotard for ballet or tap this can be used for jazz as well.

All Jazz Classes

Black Tank Leotard or tight fitting black dance/sports top
(Mondor – 11633)
Black Dance Shorts (optional)
Tan Tights (Bloch Endura Footed)
Tan Jazz Shoes (Bloch Slip On Elasta Bootie – S0499)

- Hair for girls is to be in a neat ponytail or bun, secured off the face.
- No jewelry except for small stud earrings is allowed in class. This is a safety issue.
- Warm-up sweaters, legwarmers, etc. can only be worn for the warm-up portion of class.
- Baggy t-shirts and shorts are not acceptable dancewear.
- Underwear (including bra straps) should not be visible. Underwear that shows in class is distracting and inappropriate for class. It cannot be worn on stage so it should not be worn in class either. Bras for older students may be worn if needed but straps must be completely hidden.
